~ Prime Minister Abe's remarks to the Australian Parliament ~

Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe visited New Zealand, Australia and Papua New Guinea from 6 to 12 July 2014. * GOZAN NO OKURIBI (五山の送り火):

is a traditional event that takes place in Kyoto during the Obon Festival (Festival of the Ancestors) on August 16 every year. On each of the five mountains that surround the city, giant bonfires are set alight. 5 kanjis (ideograms) are depicted by fires lit to illuminate the mountains. One of the characters is »Dai« (»large«): there are three lines for Dai and the largest one (top to the bottom left) measures 160 meters. So you can see it from far distance. The Okuribi were meant to guide the souls of the ancestors, who return to this world during the Obon period, back to the world beyond. The Okuribi are also believed to protect against evil.
