## $\sim$ The 70th Session of the United Nations General Assembly $\sim$

Between 26 and 30 September, Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and Foreign Minister Fumio Kishida visited New York to attend the 70th Session of the United Nations General Assembly. During his visit, the Prime Minister delivered an <u>address</u> at the 70th Session of the United Nations General Assembly for the third consecutive year, and also delivered a <u>statement</u> at the United Nations summit for the adoption of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. <u>Details</u>

On 5 October, at the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) Ministerial Meeting held in Atlanta, United States, an agreement in principle was reached on the TPP Agreement. # $\sim$ Election of Japan as a Non-permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council $\sim$

On 15 October, Japan was elected as a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) at the elections held during the 70th Session of the UN General Assembly in New York. As a result, Japan will serve a two-year term in the UNSC starting from January 1 of next year. Japan will contribute to make proactive contributions on a wide range of issues concerning international peace and security while on the Security Council. <u>Details</u>

### \*Shichi-Go-San (七五三), "Seven-Five-Three"

Shichigosan is a festival day in Japan for three- and seven-year-old girls and three- and five-yearold boys, held annually on November 15. It's usually celebrated on the closest weekend.

One of the common explanations for why these ages are celebrated is related to the period when the children were given a **kimono** (着物). Kimono is expensive and buying one for a child was considered a milestone on the road to adulthood. Even now, Shichigosan is the day that most children receive their first kimono.

Shichigosan is celebrated at a family's neighbourhood Shinto Shrine, where a short ceremony is held to ask the kami (god, spirit) to watch over the children. Children wear their kimonos and three-year-old girls usually wear **hifu** (被布 - a type of padded vest) with their kimono. Western-style formal wear is also worn by some children.



Children are given good luck charms and a **Chitose Ame (**千歲飴 - **"thousand year candy")**, a special type of long, thin, red and white candy that symbolizes health, growth and longevity. Afterwards, families usually have a little party at home. It's also common for families to have their photo taken at a photo studio around this time. Most parents in Japan consider Shichigosan a generally auspicious day for children. It's a day to wish for their health and happiness.
