# $\sim$ Prime Minister Abe and Foreign Minister Kishida in the United Nations General Assembly $\sim$

From 21 to 26 September, Prime Minister Abe and Foreign Minister Kishida visited New York to attend the 69<sup>th</sup> General Assembly of the United Nations. PM Abe delivered <u>a speech</u> at the General Debate as well as participated in several meetings to discuss international issues such as climate change, Ebola virus disease outbreak and others. # \* MOMIJI (紅葉, maple tree):

During the peak of the autumn season in Japan, the leaves of the maple trees and ginkgo trees turn red and yellow creating beautiful scenery at every turn. The leaves are called, "kouyou" or "momiji". The Japanese admire "momiji" in autumn just as they admire cherry blossoms in spring. Their beauty has been expressed in poems and songs throughout Japanese history. The Japanese also enjoy "momiji-gari" (autumn leaf viewing), which is regarded as a seasonal event as important as "hanami" (cherry blossom viewing).
