~ Statement by Prime Minister Abe on 70th Anniversary of the End of WWII ~

On August 14, the <u>Statement by Prime Minister Abe</u> was issued on the occasion of the 70th anniversary of the World War II. In this statement, Prime Minister Abe expressed deep remorse and heartfelt apology for Japan's action during the war. Based on the recent 70 years history of Japan as a peace proactive country, he pledged to a more active role in "Proactive Contribution to Peace".

~ Foreign Minister Kishida at the ASEAN-related Foreign Ministers' Meetings ~

On August 6, Foreign Minister Kishida attended the 22nd ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF) Ministerial Meeting, the Fifth East Asia Summit (EAS) Foreign Ministers' Meeting and the 16th ASEAN+3 Foreign Ministers' Meeting, held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Participants candidly exchanged views, primarily on regional and international affairs including the South China Sea and North Korea. Details

*Chūshū no meigetsu (中秋の名月), "The beautiful moon in the middle of autumn"

Japanese have a custom of admiring not only the cherry blossoms, but also the moon, especially in autumn. **Chūshū no meigetsu** is the full moon in mid-September and is thought to be the most beautiful and brightest moon during the year. The day is usually after harvesting all summer vegetables and before start harvesting rice. That is why it is also called **the Harvest moon**.



On that day, Japanese gather with friends and family, placing ornaments and offerings next to windows or verandas, and in other places where you can see the moon. Vases are filled with **Susuki** (pampas grass) and seasonal foods like **Tsukimi-dango** (moon viewing dumplings), pears, and sweet potatoes are placed on dishes.





According to the old Japanese stories, a rabbit lives on the moon. It is called a **Tsuki no usagi** (Moon rabbit). When you look at the moon, you can see a shape of a rabbit pounding the ingredients for **mochi** (rice cake). So, next time there is a full moon, look for the rabbit.





Many cultures through time have developed stories about the features they observed on the Moon. For example, as mentioned before, the Japanese see a rabbit, people in South Europe see a crab, and Arabians see a lion.
